





Status of Higher Education in SS Africa

- Largely modeled against colonial education systems
- Attracting relatively little capital from the private sector and or blended finance
- Investment has not kept pace with the institutional and enrollment growth
- 4. Low gross enrollment ratio AVG 9%
- Limited collection and use of data-Data not comprehensive
- 'Liberalised' but strongly controlled/ as opposed to regulated

Limited

- access and increasingly urbanized and reserved for the highest quintile
- investment < 1% of GDP and compromised inputs –
- dynamism in practices and approaches to teaching and learning
- research/IPR output and linkage with private sector and industry
- 5. differentiation
- 6. mobility across the segments

KEY MESSAGES

Agriculture will drive the economic development on the continent, and the universities, science technology and innovation have to play a significant role.

- Resolutions For the Member States and Governments:
 - Endorse the RUFORUM Charter through their respective procedures;
 - Support the strengthening of TVET systems and broader educational value chains in Africa;
 - Increase support for Graduate, Doctoral and Post-Doctoral Training in Africa;
 - Intensify efforts to strengthen staff capacities in Universities in Africa;
 - Request World Bank to provide additional funding to the ACEII

- African Union Commission and Member States to engage RUFORUM as a Technical partner in the design and implementation of the Higher Agricultural Education, Science, Technology and Innovation Initiatives
- African Governments in the Committee of Ten African Heads of States and Governments championing Education, Science, Technology and Innovation in Africa (C10) to follow up on the need for conducting regular meetings and guiding on needed actions
- Member States and Development Partners to provide support to African Universities and Research Institutions for building capacity to respond to the increasing challenges posed by climate change and transboundary animal and human health pandemics

- For the RUFORUM member institutions and other universities to
 - Advance the dignity of Africans by developing education systems that answer to people's needs through homegrown solutions
 - Support each other for capacity development for agriculture, science, technology and innovation transformation
 - Continue influencing policies direction and implementation
