market called in the local language "Agbodji" comes alive every day from 4 am to noon or even 1 pm under the hot sun whose brilliant rays pierce the surface of the water; It is a market punctuated by the sale of fishing products and exchange between sellers and buyers. Here the women run their shops on their canoes forming a concentrated mass of people active in selling various items to customers who refer to them.

Lovers' street



The street of lovers is a hydraulic street, without lamppost of course, which welcomes and shelters romantic meetings.

This name was given

to it because in the past, pigeons came in the evenings to coo along this street; which is a sign of love. Between 7 p.m. and 1 a.m., young people make romantic dates to see each other. The rue du grand canal is the major crossroads of the lakeside village of Ganvié.

Temples of the deities Sakpata and Dan



AHOUANTCHINKO : Located in the village of Dakomè, It is the divinity who helped Adjagninfindé in his migration from Adja-Tado; protective god therefore and of war, he remains one of the strong deities of the community; We also find TODAN and AHITONOU: snake gods, protectors of the city and provider of wealth and wellbeing to the populations, are also properties of the Dakomenou.
